



# WRISTBAND CHECK

## Venue

Vern Burton Community Center or the Elks building (1<sup>st</sup> and Lincoln)

## Your Commitment

- Show up on time or early for your shift
- Report to the Volunteer/Performer Check-in Tent (on the south side of 4<sup>th</sup> street, just west of the Vern Burton.) The Site Manager will check in with you either at the tent, or at your volunteer location within the first 30 minutes of your shift.
- Orient yourself with the ticket sales office, the restrooms, and where each stage is.
- Proceed to your assigned position and stay there for your entire shift. If you need to be relieved, please contact the Site Manager. She will help cover quick breaks.

## What your role entails

- Most festival-goers will show you their wristbands without prompting. If they do not, please ask
  - "Can I please see your wristband?"
  - "Do you have your wristband?"
- Children 14 and Under are FREE but are still encouraged to have wristbands if they are older than five. Use your best judgment.
- **NO ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED OUT OF THE MAIN STAGE AREA OF THE VERN BURTON.** If you are stationed at the Main Entrance, Side (Northern entrance) or Atrium (Southern entrance), you will also need to be on the lookout and remind attendees.
  - "I'm so sorry, there's no alcohol beyond this point."
  - "Oh, excuse me, alcohol is only allowed within the gym"
- Be flexible and helpful. You may be asked to check the bathrooms for supplies, walk the grounds, or clean up after a show.

Dress comfortably. Volunteer T-shirts are provided.

In exchange for fulfilling your commitment, the Juan de Fuca Foundation for the Arts will provide you with a one-day pass for the festival. This can be picked up at the Volunteer Check-in Tent.
